Festivals and Events for Families

International des Feux Loto-Quebec

(June 15 to August 6, 2022)

- After a two-year hiatus, the International des Feux Loto-Québec, Montréal's beloved fireworks festival, will be back from June 25 to August 6 to light up the city's skies.
- One of summer's most-anticipated events, the festival will be presented at Lac des
 Dauphins at La Ronde on Wednesday and Saturday evenings.
- This year's program will include the participation of six world-class pyrotechnic companies who will compete to win the hearts of spectators and the gold Jupiter trophy, the most prestigious award in the industry.

Festival International Nuits d'Afrique

(July 12 to July 24, 2022)

 For its 36th year, the Festival International Nuits d'Afrique promises another stellar program of over 100 performances, workshops, and other activities with the African, Caribbean, and Latin American diaspora in the spotlight. Bring your comfiest shoes because you'll be up on your feet dancing all evening!

Just For Laughs

(July 13 to July 31, 2022)

• We're not kidding when we say Montréal's Just For Laughs is the world's top comedy festival. But don't take our word for it—just follow the laughter from the city's theatres, clubs and streets. For it's 40th anniversary, the JFL 2022 in-person reboot guarantees guffaws and mirth galore, featuring Bill Burr and Kevin Hart at the epic-size Bell Centre.

Zoofest

(July 14 to July 31, 2022)

Since its founding in 2009, Zoofest has embraced an anything goes attitude to its
programming and events. Running simultaneously to the massive Just For Laughs and
OFF-JFL events, Zoofest brings over 125 additional performances ranging from
burlesque to theatre. Consider the envelope pushed!

Festival Fantasia

(July 14 to August 3, 2022)

One of Canada's most beloved film festivals, the Fantasia International Film Festival puts
the focus on genre cinema. Three weeks of thrills, chills and bloody spills paired with
filmmaker Q&As and other activities, mark Festival Fantasia as the movie event of the
summer.

Osheaga

(July 29 to July 31, 2022)

 A yearly must-do on North America's music festival circuits, Osheaga brings the top trend-setters to Parc Jean-Drapeau for three days of multi-stage performances of a lifetime. This year's lineup includes headliners Montréal's own Arcade Fire plus Dua Lipa and A\$AP Rocky, alongside fan favourites Mitski, Caribou, Wet Leg, Charli XCX, Pierre Kwenders and the Yeah Yeah Yeahs.

Montreal Highland Games

(July 31, 2022)

 The Montréal Highland Games return to the Douglas Hospital grounds in Verdun on Sunday, July 31, after a two-year hiatus. This family-friendly festival invites Montrealers of all backgrounds to celebrate Scottish sport, music and culture, with everything from Celtic music and pipe and drum bands to Highland dancing, medieval combat and classic Scottish athletics.

Ile Sonique

(August 5 to 7, 2022)

The leafy expanses of <u>Parc Jean-Drapeau</u> transform into the biggest outdoor nightclub dance floor when ÎleSoniq takes over in early August. As always, headliners like Swedish House Mafia, Illenium and Eric Prydz share the stage with the latest up-and-comers in electronic music, and 2022 also sees locals DVBBS and Black Tiger Sex Machine perform to some of the biggest crowds in their careers.

<u>ItalfestMTL</u>

(August 5 to 21, 2022)

For its 29th edition, ItalfestMTL offers two weeks of community pride in <u>Little Italy</u> and beyond. Food, culture and performances bring Montréal's feisty Italian community out in force to eat, dance and play the summer nights away. *Ciao bella!*

Montreal Pride

(August 1 to 7, 2022)

One of Montréal's biggest annual parties, Montréal Pride features a rainbow of
internationally beloved musicians and drag queens, endless joy in the Gay
Village quartier (in full effect on Community Day) and the powerful moment of silence
during the Parade commemorating the 2SLGBTQ+ community's history. Last but not
least, dance your cares away and get your flirt on at the closing outdoor T-Dance set to
the sounds of some of the world's top DJs.

Jackalope

(August 19-21, 2022)

Simply put, Jackalope should appear in the thesaurus as a synonym for Action and
 Adrenaline. Get ready for some of the world's most daring athletes as they demonstrate

their skills at bouldering, skateboarding and other action sports leaving audiences slackjawed in the process.

MUTEK

(August 23 to 28, 2022)

23 years after its first edition, MUTEK has long established its reputation as a world-leading festival of electronic music and digital art. Adored by both audiences and artists,
 MUTEK sets the standard for *avant garde* music and virtual experiences.

Psiscobloc

(August 27-28, 2022)

You've never seen free-climbing like what you'll experience at Psicobloc, as over 300 climbers from around the world ascend a 65-foot overhanging wall. But worry not—if they slip and tumble, the deep end of a swimming pool guarantees a soft (albeit wet) landing. Be prepared to spend the day on the edge of your seat!
